
County-Level Rates

The maps below display the knee and hip replacement rates per 10,000 residents for each of Pennsylvania's 67 counties. Rates were risk adjusted for age and sex differences among county populations. Rates include residents 20 years of age and older and were calculated using PHC4 discharge data and US Census Bureau data.

Knee replacement

The 2013 hospitalization rate for knee replacements ranged from 12.0 to 53.3 per 10,000 county residents. The statewide hospitalization rate for knee replacements was 34.4 per 10,000 residents.



County-Level Rates

Hip replacement

The 2013 hospitalization rate for hip replacements ranged from 8.0 to 23.5 per 10,000 county residents. The statewide hospitalization rate for hip replacements was 17.5 per 10,000 residents.
